I have given my notice early in order for the Governing Body to make a smooth transition for the future leadership of the school.

School Meals

Dinners are free under the Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme for EYFS, Years 1 and 2. The cost of a school dinner remains at £2.40 per meal for Years 3, 4, 5 & 6. Our dinners are collected every day by taxi service from County Hall in West Bridgford and served by Mrs Lawrence here in school with the support of staff. The dinners are excellent value and popular with the children.

Drumba Sessions

I hope your child is enjoying their Drumba sessions on Fridays. These are being paid for out of our School Sports Premium. It is an exercise format that combines drumsticks with dance steps to create a fast paced, intense cardio workout for the upper and lower body. As a school we are required to show the impact of this funding stream and consider the benefit on pupils' physical well-being. Drumba offers us an alternative activity alongside traditional sporting activities, is inclusive and ensures full participation rates. School Council

We had lots to discuss at our recent School Council meeting - the minutes have been typed up and put on display in school on the School Council notice board.

The group agreed to organise and run a toy swap event on **Thursday 9th February**, just before half term. Children can bring in a toy/game on that day, which they no longer play with, and swap it for a different one.

We also discussed Red Nose Day which is coming up in March - details to follow.

Arabella and Duke, our UKS2 School Council members, will be representing the school at the next Pupil Parliament on Friday 3rd February. 'Kids Against Plastic' are the guest speakers at the session and there will be an opportunity for the Pupil Parliament reps to ask Kids Against Plastic questions. We look forward to hearing the feedback from them both.

Book Week

Our School Council also discussed World Book Day, which is on Thursday 2nd March. Children are invited to come to school dressed as a fictional character on this day- time to get planning! This is not a fund-raising event; it is part of our Book Week which runs from Monday 27th February. Staff are planning book activities and story swaps for the week. Look out for World Book Day tokens and information on how to use them arriving home in book bags before half term. School Council are also planning a book swap on World Book Day itself. Children can bring in a book and swap it for a different one.

Playground

We have had a new black 'mesh' put around the main part of the playground to replace the green fencing that was there before. This stops smaller balls etc going through onto the road and is much smarter and more practical than the old fence which constantly used to rip and blow down in the wind.

Mrs Barker and FOWS have also been planning the upgrade of the canopy area for EYFS using the Co-op funding. We will keep you updated on developments as they happen.
