Did you know that missing five days of every term every year is the same as missing one whole school year? School cannot authorise absence for holidays, visiting friends or relatives and the like. The expectation is that all our children attend school for 100% of the sessions in a year, recognising acceptable reasons for absence for genuine illness and medical reasons. My thanks to the overwhelming majority of our parents for ensuring their child(ren) have no recorded unauthorised absences.
