


## Year 5/6 Creative Homework Summer 2 2026

This half term we will be learning about World War II in history, athletics in PE, frame structures in DT, all about school in French, diary entries in English and we will also be having weekly forest school sessions. To immerse yourself further with our school topics we are setting these exciting homework tasks.  <p>Go cloud-watching, number 33 on the list of '50 things to do before you're 11<math>\frac{3}{4}</math>'. Choose a warm, summer's day when there are plenty of clouds in the sky. Lie back on the grass and look up. Use your imagination to pick out shapes and pictures in the clouds as they drift by. Invent a story using the 'characters' you see in the clouds, or write a poem describing what you see.</p>	 <p>Think about what we have been learning at forest school. Have a go at building a small den using natural materials or create a piece of forest art using leaves, sticks, stones or flowers. Perhaps create a game out of the materials you find outside. Take a photograph or draw a picture of what you made.</p>
<p>Create your own Anderson shelter. Use recycled materials such as cardboard boxes, paper, tins or plastic containers to build a model of a World War II Anderson shelter. Can you make it camouflage using paint, paper, leaves or fake grass? Think carefully about the shape, size and features that would have helped keep families safe during air raids. Be as creative as you like and bring your finished model into school to share with the class.</p>	<p>In DT this term, we'll have a challenge to build a structure for a bridge- the stronger the better! A new bridge is being put in place in Rushcliffe, to join Lady Bay to the city. This will need to be strong enough for many people to cross.</p> <p>Can you take photos, sketch or research any local bridges, or bridges you have crossed, or famous bridges? Do you notice anything about them? Do they have anything in common?</p>
	
<p>Write a diary entry about an exciting or nerve-racking day. You could write about something you have experienced – a day at Alton Towers, a football tournament, riding your horse or having a sleep over with a friend. You could imagine you are a child during World War II, perhaps one who has been evacuated. Remember to write in the first person, include your thoughts and feelings, and describe what happened throughout the day.</p> 	<p>Create a simple timetable in French showing your school day. Write the names of your lessons in French and include the times they start and finish. You could present your work as a colourful timetable, poster or chart. Challenge yourself to write a full sentence describing your favourite lesson and why you enjoy it.</p>
