This half term we will be learning about light in science, biomes in geography, Andy Warhol pop art in art, percussion in music and traditions and celebrations in French. To immerse yourself further within these topics we are setting optional homework tasks. Select an activity or activities from the choosing grid – you can complete as many as you like and be creative!

During the week beginning 19th May we will be having a homework showcase where you will get the chance to share your amazing work so please bring everything in that week. Can you paint a portrait of yourself in the style of Andy Warhol. You could print off a photograph of yourself, trace it and use then make repeated images. Paint or colour each image in bright, contrasting colours.



Can you make a shadow puppet show with cardboard cut-out characters and a torch placed behind. How would you change the size of your characters, just by using your light-source.



Compose a short piece for percussion. Use objects from around the house or garden as instruments, or body percussion to create different sounds. You could even make an instrument too. Use symbols for each instrument or sound to write your composition down. Can you video yourself performing it to your family and friends.



French – create a leaflet describing a French celebration or tradition. For example, how is Easter or Christmas celebrated in France? What about Bastille Day or La Fête des Rois?
