Safeguarding Update

There are two new safeguarding policy updates that have recently been put onto the school website. These are:

- Child on Child Abuse (formerly Peer on Peer Abuse)
- Anti-bullying Policy

Both policies have significantly changed from the previous policies and run alongside our Child Protection Policy.

Thank you all for returning the e-safety slips and reading through the behaviour booklets with your children. All of the children have been reminded of the Willoughby Golden Rules which are on display in every classroom. It has been such a lovely start to the term. The children have settled in beautifully, are eager to learn and are rekindling old friendships and building new ones.

School Council Members

In the second week of term each class was asked to vote for their School Council representatives. The members are elected by their peers in their year group. The School Council meets 3 times a term and discusses and organises events and issues brought forward by the representatives. In the first meeting everyone was given their badges and we had an initial discussion. The group decided to support the Children in Need and the Christmas Jumper Days this Autumn term. They also discussed a biscuit sale and a book and toy swap.

The whole school assemblies take place three times a week and twice a week they are in classes. Assemblies are a very valuable time for us all to get together as a school. There is always a theme- which changes weekly- and the children are read stories, poems and information which relate to the theme. We finish off assembly with a song (organised by a year 6 monitor) before we go into lunch.
