Primary PE and Sports Premium 2021/22

Updated July 2022 (to include requirement to report Y6 swimming and Evidencing the Impact' document).

Along with all primary schools Willoughby Primary receives an annual PE and Sports Premium budget allocation. The vision of the Primary PE and School Sport Premium is as follows:

A measurable and sustained improvement in school PE and sport, underpinned by high quality teaching that increases participation levels in physical activity and leads to healthier pupils who are more engaged across the whole curriculum.

Each Primary school receives an amount based on the number of pupils on roll in Years 1-6 plus a core amount. At Willoughby Primary the level of our funding is £16384 for the academic year (2021/22). This sum is 'ring fenced' and can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. During the year 2021/22 Governors decided to continue the hours of our Primary Link teacher (commencing September 2021), rather than employing a sports coach.

Our spending was used to enhance the teaching and learning opportunities in P.E and sport as follows:

- Continued hours for our Primary Link teacher to champion PE, deliver lessons and coordinate opportunities across the school (PLT)
- Rushcliffe School Sports Partnership fee
- Specialist Sports providers to promote specific skills

IMPACT: We have reviewed the impact of the grant and conclude that as a result of the extra funding the quality of PE teaching and learning has improved across the school. Pupils have benefitted from specialist coaching, which has allowed them to develop specific skills (e.g. in tag rugby and cricket skills) and have developed their speed and agility (Drumba).

We have been able to use the knowledge and organisation of the PE teacher and enhance that with expertise from an outside provider (eg tag rugby and Drumba). These initiatives have led to improvements in curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities and increased levels of participation in sport and physical activity as well as benefitting mental health.

Pupils' attainment has improved and pupils who don't always participate in competitions have been targeted to attend Top Link, which is hosted by our local secondary school.

<u>Swimming</u>

As of July 2022: 100% of Year 6 cohort achieved the requirements to:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 meters.
- Use a range of strokes effectively.

In Summary there has been:

- > A continuation of participation rates e.g. games, cricket, football
- an increase and success in competitive school sports (e.g. plate runners up in regional cricket comp & runners up in local Rounders Competition)
- > a more inclusive the physical education curriculum (e.g. Top Link open to all)
- provision after school sports (some free of charge)
- a growth in the range of traditional and alternative sporting activities (e.g. Drumba)
- an improvement in partnership work on physical education with other schools and other local partners (Rushcliffe Partnership and work with Keyworth Cricket Club and Notts CC)
- Improved links with other subjects that contribute to pupils' overall achievement and their greater social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills
- greater awareness amongst pupils about the dangers of obesity, smoking and other such activities that undermine pupils' health
- > sustained high standards in pupil behaviour and engagement
